

As The TATTLER teased weeks ago, Conclave 2000 keynoter Jesse Ventura will be the host of a talk show on MSNBC. The good news is the former Governor of Minnesota will get a prime time spot, probably 9PM. The bad news is MSNBC is struggling to garner an audience. In the first two weeks of January, it averaged 397,000 nationwide viewers during prime time, well behind Fox News' 1.3 million and CNN's 941,000. According the Minneapolis Star-Tribune's Neal Justin, in Minneapolis during the 9PM hour, the number of households tuned in is often fewer than 100. Obviously, the cable network is hopeful Jesse's presence should help shore up its troubled numbers. Says NPR media expert Brooke Gladstone, "He's got crossover appeal, has name recognition, has a funny way of talking, and people love that illusion of no-nonsense, that schtick of sincerity." As you may remember, Jesse's job prior to winning the Minnesota governorship in 1998 was talk-show host at Clear Channel's sports-talk KFAN/Minneapolis (and prior to that stint, he'd done a show on KSTP-AM/Minneapolis). While the network hasn't officially announced the addition of Ventura to its lineup, it's known that Jesse will be in San Diego for the Super Bowl this weekend...and to shoot some promotional videos for the new show. We'll keep you posted!

In case you were wondering how to cast your vote, Richard Crenna still on this year's Radio Hall Of Fame Ballot. The competition's sponsor, Chicago's Museum of Broadcast Communications says that Richard Crenna's passing last week doesn't remove him from the Radio Hall of Fame ballot: "Crenna is the second nominee to die during the RHOF voting process," says the Museum's Bruce Dumont. "Wolfman Jack" also died during the balloting period, but he was not selected during that year. The Wolfman was selected one year later. "Crenna will remain on the 2003 ballot along with Gene Autry, Douglas Edwards and Walter Winchell, all of whom are deceased," Dumont continues. "Ballots will be sent out in early May. August 1 is the voting deadline." Crenna's nomination stems from his role as Walter Denton on the Our Miss Brooks radio program in the late 1940's/early 1950's. He also starred in that role when the radio show moved to network television. The 2003 Radio Hall of Fame ceremonies will be held Saturday, November 8 in Chicago.

Regent's St. Cloud cluster experienced some managerial changes this week as GM Cal Hall announced he is transferring to a GM position at Regent's Fort Collins, CO cluster. Sales manager David Engberg has assumed GM duties in St. Cloud, but will not be overseeing the Company's new Duluth cluster, while Hall did. In St. Cloud, Regent operates country WWJO (98.1), news/talk WJON-AM (1240), classic rock KLZZ (103.7), classic country KXSS-AM (1390), CHR KKSR (96.7), and hot A/C KMXK (94.9). In Duluth, Regent's properties are hot A/C KBMX (107.7), country KKCB (105.1), oldies KLDJ (101.7), and news/talk WEBC-AM (560).

Clear Channel's proposed acquisition of KXMR/Bismarck (reported two weeks ago in *The TATTLER*) has hit a red flag with the FCC. In Bismarck, Clear Channel holds only hot A/C KYYY (92.9) and full service KFYR-AM (550). However, KXMR's contour includes Minot, where Clear Channel already owns 6 out of 6 non-religious commercial stations. Clear Channel's control of the Minot market was also recently under fire by North Dakota Senator Byron Dorgan, during the hearings on Capitol Hill last week.

A few weeks ago, *The TATTLER* reported that **Salem**/Twin Cities AM 1570 KYCR had seen a mysterious "vanishing act" from the brokered programmers of its format, Spanish variety "La Pantera." Staffers arrived January 1 to find all signs of La Pantera gone, CD players and files empty, with dead air on the station. They've been simulcasting sister religious talker KKMS (980) since, and now Salem will introduce a new format on 1570 in a few days. On February 3, KYCR will debut a "health and financial talk" format, featuring Twin Cities veteran TV meteorologist **Barry ZeVan** in the 3pm to 6pm afternoon slot. The station will also air some shows live which are heard in tape-delay on sister conservative talker AM 1280 "The Patriot" (WWTC). Expect syndicated **Laura Ingraham** and **Roger Fredinburg** to air in evenings on the new station.

Noncomm **AMPERS** affiliate KFAI/Twin Cities (90.3 Minneapolis and 106.7 St. Paul) recently moved **Ron "Boogiemonster" Gerber's** weekly '80s music show "Crap From The Past" to Friday nights, 10:30pm to 12Midnight. Now, the show (which has been on the air in various cities for nearly 11 years) has a weekly affiliate in New Zealand! The show now also airs at 7pm Saturday nights on **GoldRush Radio**, 91.1 FM and 1440 AM, in Lawrence, Otago, New Zealand. "Crap From The Past" is an in-depth journey through forgotten gems, dance mixes, hits, rarities, and thematic programming. Recent shows have featured long-form interviews with songwriter **Holly Knight**, a tribute to two-hit wonders, exclusively Australia and New Zealand-based artists, and a show entirely in Spanish (including the talk breaks and all songs) to celebrate Cinco de Mayo. SBS and HBC are continuing their national example of disagreements in Chicago. SBS has filed a letter with the FCC complaining that HBC's deal with Big City Radio for WVIV-FM (formerly WXXY), including its temporary use of Superior Broadcasting as an interim owner while HBC brokers the station's programming, sets a "dangerous precedent" allowing HBC to circumvent ownership rules. SBS says it will file a formal petition to deny the sale. SBS has also been very critical over HBC's pending merger with Univision.
