Those stations included WNND and WLIT/Chicago, WMYX and WLTQ/Milwaukee, WMLL/St. Louis, WYXY/Evansville, IN, WFCB/Ashville, OH, and KOSI/Denver. Nationally, KLTH/Portland, WWSW/Pittsburgh, and KMYI/San Diego all switched today. In Milwaukee, **Entercom's** hot AC WMYX flipped at 8AM this morning...which beat **Clear Channel's** soft AC WLTQ to become the city's first all-holiday station by about 5 minutes. WMYX is now going by "99WMYX, Your Home For The Holidays", and takes on WLTQ – which began its third year of holiday programming today. Comment. None of the major industry trades reflected on it, but Rush Limbaugh's return to the airwaves on Monday contained an exchange worthy of analysis. Responding to the question of hypocrisy (Rush had condemned drug usage – and users – for years, witness his condemnation of Jerry Garcia upon his death a few years ago), Rush commented that there was "no hypocrisy" to be found on his program. Just because HE used and abused (reputed) illicitly obtained drugs, doesn't mean the MES-



SAGE of condemning drugs and their users was wrong. On that point, Limbaugh is absolutely correct. But what he ignores in his statement is his role as the COMMUNICATOR of the idea. In other words, what he proudly represents on the air is not necessarily what he practices when his mic is turned off...and it shouldn't matter to anyone tuning in his show. While Rush may find personal comfort in his "no hypocrisy" stance of Monday, listeners to his program – by conservative estimates, about 20 million or so – could easily identify a believability issue bubbling between Rush's words, actions and his so-called values. For an on-air commentator, Limbaugh's cavalier admission of this credibility gap won't play well in the long term for his listeners, advertisers, and his syndicator, Premiere Radio. But then again, it may not matter much if his alleged money laundering proceeds into court. (We also suspect Rush didn't gain many Wisconsin fans with his putdown of Oshkosh on his post-treatment debut program. Last time we counted, the population of the vital Northeast WI city had a few more than 10 residents...as he alleged earlier this week!)

In one of the more interesting contests in a while, earlier this week the KCHZ/Kansas City Morning Zoo impressed listeners with their "Tongue For Tickets" contest. The morning duo of **Dave & Shorty** recruited 4 married couples (with one married couple consisting of two women) to the studio to see who could kiss the longest. The catch was, the individuals kissed one of the other contestants, not their spouses. Each individual's time was then added together, with the longest overall kissing couple wining. Naturally, the winning couple was the two ladies. One of the gals made out with a man, and the other made out with one of the other couples' wives.
