

If a movie actor and professional wrestler can run for governor, why not a radio owner? Dave Magnum of Magnum Radio is considering just that! Now that the FCC rule changes killed his deal to sell six of his LaCrosse stations to Mid-West Family Radio for a reputed \$4.3 million, he's scaled back his political ambitions...to run for Governor of Wisconsin. Originally, he'd decided to run against Sen. Russ Feingold (D-WI) in 2004. But the FCC ruled in June to switch from contour overlaps to the use of Arbitron to define radio markets, leaving his deal with Mid-West Family at the altar. Now that he's committed himself to run the stations (he'd decided to sell most of his stations and focus on raising his two sons after his young wife's death from cancer last December), Magnum has decided on a run for state governorship. This week, he told RBR - "I've brought in 10 new people to manage the three markets, with the goal that by the end of next year I'm being encouraged to run for Governor against [incumbent] Jim Doyle [D] in the next cycle [2006]. Everything that I'm doing every day is centered around trying to get these stations to a point that I don't have to have any involvement so that I can move into this next phase." When asked if his ambitions were, well, too ambitious Magnum replied "I've got people who believe that this is something that is very doable and if everything goes according to plan we're going to start this process at the end of next year."

In what must surely sound like music to "the Industry's" collective ears, a new study by market research group Ipsos reported that upwards of 10 million Americans (sixteen percent of all people 12+) paid a fee to download music or MP3 files off the Internet in late June of 2003. (Approximately around the same time the RIAA announced their plans to prosecute people who violate copyright laws by illegally downloading music files.) According to the study, 18-24 year olds are most likely to download digital music, representing 22 percent of paid download consumers. However, 10 percent of people aged 25-54 indicate they've also downloaded music or an MP3 file. Interestingly, those who download and are in the 12-17 demo were the least likely to pay for their digital music. The study's author, Matt Kleinschmit, says, "a twofold increase in the number of American downloaders exposed to for-pay music downloads in just a six month timeframe (compared to 8 percent in December 2002 and 13 percent in April 2003) signals a remarkable shift in downloader behavior." And if that wasn't enough good news on the sales front, reports of Britney Spears' new record debuting with over half a million sold, and at least (10) other current albums having sold over 100,000 units this week, things have started to look up at retail with several weeks of big holiday spending still to come! (In 10 of the last 11 weeks, record sales have outperformed those of one year ago.)
