


Clear Channel, the philanthropist! Clear Channel Radio/ Minneapolis Market Manager Dan Seeman, whose group includes Smooth Jazz KJZI, presented a check for \$25,000 to help assist KBEM-FM, a non-commercial teaching Jazz station which lost a \$418,000 funding contract to supply traffic reports for the Twin Cities. Seeman told the TATTLER that after the group heard about the funding crisis, they decided to lend a hand. "This was really pretty much a 'no-brainer.' We read about their problems, and decided we should help the station get out from under this financial crisis. It was not only a station in need, but a non-commercial public station dedicated to teaching radio to hundreds of students each year." In addition to the large donation, CC will broadcast messages on several of its Twin Cities stations, asking listeners to support KBEM. It also plans to help the station with its winter jazz festival and future pledge drives. KBEM is owned by the Minneapolis School District and operates out of North High School. Seeman, Brian Turner (representing CC's KTCZ), and Carolyn Peterson (representing KJZI) went live with the presentation yesterday during the KBEM's hastily formed Radiothon to raise \$130,000 to keep the station afloat. With CC's check, KBEM had raised \$112,000 as of yesterday. (FYI there is movement in the state legislature to restore at least part of the funding swept away earlier this month).

Minnesota Public Radio – one of the nation's largest public radio groups – launched eclectic AAA/Alt KCMP Monday morning. Keeping true to its promise of featuring local/regional artists, the station kicked off with Minneapolis' Atmosphere and "Shhh." Other artists featured prominently: Low, The Hives, Citizen Cope, Belle & Sebastian, The Hang-Ups...along with occasional drop-in tracks by Billie Holiday, Johnny Cash, Robert Johnson, and Frank Sinatra. Dubbed the *Current*, the station line-up includes MD Thorn (9–2P), Mary Lucia (2-7P), Mark Wheat (7-mid), Steve Seel (overnights), and Bill Deville/Tony Lopez/Jill Riley (weekends). It also became the new home for MPR's "Morning Show" featuring Dale Connelly and **Jim Ed Poole** (5-9A) weekdays. It's being programmed by **Steve Nelson**, whose credits include the late Rev/Minneapolis (the trio of signals purchased by **ABC** years ago, which is now known as The Drive). The station flipped from classical-music WCAL, bought by MPR from **St. Olaf College**/Northfield at the end of last year. Just how radical is the station? Let's start with how the station may receive its music. On their website yesterday – "If you have specific CDs to recommend, things you think should definitely be in our library, we'd love to hear about that (just respond to the blog). Or, if you want to you can send us a CD by mail or drop it off at the front desk and tell us which tracks you think we should play and why." Hey kids on the commercial band: don't try this at home!

The **FCC** and **Congress** plan to continue their battle to clean up "indecent" broadcasting on both radio and television. This week chairman of the House Commerce subcommittee Rep. **Fred Upton** unveiled a bill that would up fines for decency violations to as much as \$500,00 per infraction. A three strikes rule is also being considered, wherein the FCC could revoke a station's license after a third offense. Another bill, championed by **Sen. Sam Brownback** of Kansas (R), proposes that fines top out at \$325,000 per violation with a 3million maximum. The hope is that these stricter penalties will decrease incidents of nudity and profanity. If passed, the bills will have to be reconciled before being passed along for approval by **President Bush.** 

TV alert!
