

YOUR DUKE, HIS ROCKWELL!

The Conclave is proud to announce it's 2005 Rockwell Award recipient: **Dave "Your Duke" Sholin!** Dave has been a Conclave fixture for the past 20 years or so as a radio programmer, trade journalist, and label executive. In radio, Dave's exploits include achieving great success at legendary San Francisco station KFRC, where he's credited with the development of Hot A/C. After KFRC, he



became National Music Director for RKO (the chain that owned KFRC). After radio, Sholin tackled radio trade journalism, as the Top 40 editor for the *Gavin Report* – a publication he and several other editors (including 1997 recipient, Ron Fell) purchased from Bill Gavin, an early Conclave benefactor. In addition, Dave hosted syndicated Top 40 shows for Westwood One and Premiere Radio, which were broadcast in the U.S. and in Japan. After Gavin, he jumped to the music industry as VP of Promotion for Island Records. He eventually moved to Capitol Records, before joining the multimedia firm **MusicBiz.com** where he's still partnered with former Infinity VP Steve Rivers and industry maven, Gerry Cagle. He's currently the VP/Adult Formats for the EMI Music Collective. The Rockwell won't be his first industry accolade: He's a member of Cleveland's Rock and Roll Hall of Fame! On December 8, 1980 – while with KFRC - he interviewed **John Lennon**...4 hours before Lennon was assassinated in front of New York's Dakota Hotel. A regular Conclave faculty member and moderator, Duke is widely known for his magnanimous mentoring, and many of his "students" have gone on to great accomplishment in the industry. If you want to find Duke at a Conclave, it's easy. Just look for a Marriott sofa, a wall by the elevators, or a table inside the bar; there will be Dave - huddled with a young air talent or a fledgling promotion rep just given their first territory. Dave will receive the Rockwell – the Conclave's lifetime

achievement award - during the 30th Anniversary Learning Conference, July 21-24, at the Marriott City Center in Minneapolis.

By now, you know that the *Broadcast Decency Act of 2005* born from the pen of **Michigan** Republican Congressman **Fred Upton** cleared the House this week. If it passes in the Senate (experts don't give it much chance), the fine for indecency rises to a cool half-million dollars. Only 38 members of the House of Representatives voted against it, with 389 supporting the measure. That means, there were almost twice as many members of the House who were cosponsors- 67- than there were votes against it. The Republican vote was 228-1, while Democrats went for the measure 161-36. The lone independent, **Bernie Sanders** (I-VT) was against it. Two Republicans and four Democrats failed to record a vote. In the Midwest, the following Representatives voted against, mostly citing first amendment fears: **William "Lacy" Clay Jr.** (D-MO), **John Conyers Jr.** (D-MI), **Dennis J.Kucinich** (D-OH), **Martin Olav Sabo** (D-MN), **Jan Schakowsky** (D-IL). Ouch.

Joseph J. Ulrey, better known to Wisconsinites as Joe Mason, a reporter for ABC affiliate WKOW-TV/Madison, was arrested on Friday (2/11). The 25-year-old pulled a gun while at Oldies WCEZ-AM/Beloit. The building was evacuated and Ulrey was quickly subdued. He was charged with carrying a concealed weapon, disorderly conduct while armed, and marijuana possession. Earlier in the day the young reporter got into an argument at the Merrill Community Center where he claimed to be on official news business. The station has denied this claim.

The **Nextmedia** Country WEXT(104.7 The Wolf) /Milwaukee morning show was treated to an unexpected phone call on their hotline this week. Host **Jim Shea** spoke with **Lance Cpl. David Mathetty** and **PFC Patrick Vanderwal**. The soldiers called from Iraq on a satellite phone that had been purchased by WEXT with funds from the station's **The Wolf Operation Phone Home** promotion. Before WEXT bought the phones, letters were the only form of communication the Marines had.

Who knows where evil lurks? **Cumulus** Talker WWCK-AM/Flint host **Dave Barber** knows! Or at least he's trying to find out. He will be going ahead with his plan to give a lie detector test to **Joe Giacalone**. As reported in the 11/1/04 *Tattler*, Giaclone has been accused by Mayor **Don Williamson** of swindling the city of Flint out of more than \$1 million. The accused maintains his innocence, and will soon join Barber on the air where polygraph expert **Henry Hansen** will administer the Barber-funded test. Stay tuned for the exciting outcome of this real-life radio drama!

(With this issue of the TATTLER, we begin a 30-year retrospective of the summer Conclave Learning Conference and what may have happened inside and outside the industry during each of its 30 years. This week, we go back to 1976!) In the first Conclave year – 1976 – Peter Frampton released the biggest selling double album of all time, Frampton Comes Alive. The #1 song during Conclave week: EW&F's "Shining Star." The RIAA creates a new platinum award; the first platinum single -Johnnie Taylor's "Disco Lady" ... the first platinum album the **Eagles**' *Greatest Hits 1971-1975*. *Street Talk* first appeared in R&R. KYA/San Francisco debuted the "Superstars" format. The FCC submitted anti-obscenity legislation, ultimately voted down. Bill Gavin keynotes the first Conclave, and The Gavin Report hosts its first cocktail party. A first-year session: "What Is Secondary about a Market with 7.5 Million People" with a faculty including Art Roberts, Ron Geslin, Lenny Beer, Mark Renier, Peter McLane, Tom Barsanti and Tom Kay (who looked dashing in his white leisure suit!). Attendees included Marc Ratner, John Sebastian, Bob Denver, Marc Nathan, Mike Schied, Jonathan Little, and Pam Benson Horovitz.
