## From All Access-

<u>Urban</u>: From the Urban perspective, this was a banner year for The Conclave. The Urban "Our World Is Exploding" session featured top programmers and record execs from across America. Co-moderator and KRNB/Dallas OM **Sam Weaver**, Gray Communications President **Tony Gray**, WKKV/Milwaukee Pf **Bailey Coleman**, WJLB-WMXD/Detroit OM **K.J. Holiday** and Capitol SVP/Urban Promo **Geo Bivins** all contributed and participated in a heated discussion about what adjustments Urban radio and music are going to have to make to survive and flourish in the future. The session also addressd the issue of training tomorrow's air-personalities and format leaders.

**AC/Hot AC**: In the Adult radio formats, Hot AC panels included informative insight from such notable format leaders as **Mary Ellen Kachinske** of WTMX (101.9 THE Mix)/Chicago, **Bob Walker** of WKTI/Milwaukee and **J.J. Morgan** of KFBZ (THE Buzz)/Wichita, KS. **Mcvay Media** presented three informative learning summits, and **Kurt Steffek** and the folks at **Razor & Tie** records staged a performance by rising star **Kelly Sweet** at the Mainstream AC Symposium.

Rock: The Rock crew at the Conclave dominated the Minneapolis nightlife. Great performances came from Virgin's 30 Seconds To Mars, Roadrunner's Dragonforce and Century Media's Lacuna Coil. And a Harddrive party brought everyone together for "spirited" discussion on all things Rock 'n Roll. Friday the Rock panel brought insight from those well-stocked with insightful opinions like WRIF/Detroit PD Doug Podell and KAZR/Des Moines PD Ryan Patrick.

### From Billboard Radio Monitor-

**Steinem:** 'Less Heat And More Light' - Feminist, journalist and spokeswoman for women's rights **Gloria Steinem** appeared here as a keynoter at the 31st annual Conclave learning conference. Her presentation, titled "Broadcasting . . . As If Women Mattered," began

with Steinem, who is one of the founders of female-targeted Greenstone Media, talking about the importance of radio in her life. Because her family traveled frequently when she was young, "Radio became my school and became my community," Steinem said. "Radio taught me to love stories. It taught me about what was going on in the world." Today, talk radio in particular has a different approach, she believes. "It seems to me that talk radio has become less about community and more about conflict," she told the Conclave attendees. "It's less about improving ourselves and more about being angry at the world." "What this audience wants is less heat and more light," she says of the current conflictladen approach. "We tend to feel that radio has left us," she said in explaining the formation of Greenstone. The fact that men make up the majority of programmers and GMs in commercial radio has led to an over-reliance on quantitative measurement to find out what women listeners want. That reliance has led to "formulaic and un-creative radio," Steinem says. According to anecdotal and hard-data research her company has done, Steinem says women are interested in current events, humor, dating and other lifestyle topics. Interestingly, they are also interested in how women live in other countries. "They don't want politics and they don't want sports," Steinem says, noting that the latter is relevant because sports have been painted as a male-only domain. Good programming, Steinem said, is about "information, humor and creating an on-air community." "Women want news in all forms," Steinem said, "That's why women's listening to public radio has gone up 25% in the last six years." Despite that, Greenstone won't be simply a female version of NPR, she said. The company's female-centric approach willl bring both female and male listeners back to radio, according to Steinem. "We're going to create a modern version of the campfire," she said, explaining how humans developed their storytelling skills long before television added pictures. "We're going to create a new golden age of radio." (Ken Tucker)

Arbitron Commits Big Bucks To Boost Response -The perennial problem of declining response rates has spurred Arbitron to increase, significantly, the amount of money it spends as an incentive to get people to participate. Arbitron SVP of marketing Bill Rose told an audience of about 70 Conclavers that the average metro response rates have dropped regularly from just above 40% in 1998 to the new low of just over 30% now. Rose made the point concisely during his presentation when he said "The best way to improve response rates is to give cash." The only drawback to this tactic, Rose told Billboard Radio Monitor after his presentation, is that a cash incentive "has diminishing effect over time." As he explained it, if an individual responds to Arbitron after receiving \$1 the chances are somewhat lower that this same person will respond the same way after receiving another dollar the next time he or she is asked to participate. Still, Arbitron is making what is clearly a major effort to reverse the decline in response rates.

Arbitron plans to move from giving 48% of the homes \$1 with a pre placement letter, to doing so with all mailable sample homes by the end of 2006. The rollout of this increase will come in two phases: Half of the remaining markets will be included with the Spring 2006 survey. The remainder will be included with the Fall survey. Today, nearly two-thirds of all metro households get a \$1 minimum. That's going to move to

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100% of all metro households over the course of the next 12 months. In addition, Arbitron will increase the minimum premium from \$1 to \$2. In Spring 2006, Arbitron will increase the minimum premium in the 22 markets with the lowest response rates. In Fall 2006, Arbitron will do so in half of the remaining markets so that by Spring 2007 all metro households will receive a \$2 minimum premium.

Those ever-elusive younger men, 18-34, are on the premium target list, too. Arbitron is expanding its \$5 premium that goes to one- and two-person households of 18-to-24-year-old men to cover all 297 markets. That boost in bucks begins in earnest with the Spring 2006 survey. Rose didn't offer a total-dollar figure that Arbitron will spend on this new effort. (**Tony Sanders**)

Big news in Michigan and Ohio, as Clear Channel and Cumulus put together a huge swap of properties in Battle Creek, Ann Arbor, and Canton/Youngstown. In a deal announced to each station's respective staffs last Wednesday (8/16), here's the trade: Cumulus will be trading rock WRQK-FM, standards WSOM-AM, and country WQXK-FM in Canton-Youngstown, OH to Clear Channel for Ann Arbor's country WWWW-FM, triple A WQKL-FM, N/T WTKA-AM, and Air America formatted WLBY-AM AND Battle Creek's adult WBXX-FM, classic rock WWKN-FM, N/T WBCK-AM, and sports WBFN-AM. According to **Michiquide.com**, "(The trade) explains the recent call letter changes at AM 1310 Detroit, which dropped its WDTW calls in favor of WWWW, and FM 102.9 Ann Arbor which became WWWW-FM in July after a brief switch to WFOR-FM from WWWW- which it took in October of 2000 after residing at FM 106.7 Detroit since the 1960s. Clear Channel obviously wants to keep control of those highly desirable calls in the Detroit market." We'll share more details as they become available.

Nationwide news broke out this week that Troy Gentry of Montgomery **Gentry** appeared in federal court for the alleged killing of a tame black bear. According to Federal officials, Gentry shot the bear after buying it and placing it in an enclosed pen. After shooting the bear, he tagged it as if he had shot it in the wild. Gentry, 39, was seen in court before a federal judge in Duluth, MN. His appearance in court was the result of a sealed indictment returned from a federal Minneapolis grand jury in July. The government maintained that Gentry tagged the bear, named 'Cubby', and killed it on a wildlife refuge owned by Lee Marvin Greenly, 46, in 2004, with a Minnesota hunting license. After killing it, he registered the bear with the state Department of Natural Resources, claiming he had killed it in the wild. Such false tagging violates federal laws. A press-release was issued this morning on Gentry's behalf, stating that he is pleading 'not-guilty' to the charge, maintaining that he is an 'avid environmentalist and hunter who follows all game laws.' In addition, the announcement states that Troy, "absolutely denies that he knowingly and willfully did anything illegal."

Keep an eye out this September for syndicated hosts **Bob Kevoian** and **Tom Griswold**, who will take a shot at TV, as **Comedy Central** will air a primetime special: "Bob and Tom Radio: The Comedy Tour." Their one-hour show will consist of stand-up performances from five

comedians. Viewers will also watch the featured comedians as they interact with Bob and Tom on their radio show. Griswold told Variety that if the September 16<sup>th</sup> program proves to score high enough ratings, producer **Levity Productions** is committed to producing two or three additional shows. **Image Entertainment** will also bring the program out on DVD.

**Midway Broadcasting**, belonging to **Melody Spann-Cooper**, inked a five-year lease deal (including purchase option) to take over programming on **Clear Channel** Oldies WRLL- AM/ Chicago, which begins on September 18<sup>th</sup> to carry Midway's African-American Talk programming which currently heard on a shared-time basis on crosstown WVON- AM. As a result of the move, WVON reclaims 24/7 status. WVON moved to share 1450 AM with brokered Ethnic WCEV- AM years ago and now airs first-run programming from 5am to 1pm and 10pm to midnight weekdays. **Elroy Smith**, of Clear Channel's WGCI-WGRB-AM-WVAZ, will serve as OM.

**Stephen Trivers** was announced by **McVay Media** as an addition to **McVay Media Advisors Alliance**. Trivers, a former partner in and GM of **Fairfield Broadcasting** in western Michigan, will serve as a management consultant. Recently, Trivers launched **Stephen Trivers LLC**, a business consulting firm specializing in management guidance, sales training and personal coaching.

After 23 years, R&R's Country Editor Lon Helton resigned to start his own independent company. Helton will put out a daily Country news publication through email, a weekly Country update powered by Mediabase. Associate Country Editor, Chuck Ally, will be following Helton immediately as he, too, exits R&R. Dir./Country Charts Wade Jessen will replace Helton at R&R.

Arbitron has released its summary of response rates, consent rates, and return rates for the 297 markets included in the Spring '06 survey. Overall, the Spring '06 survey found the average Metro survey area response rate declined 1.3%, going from 31.7% in Spring '05 to 30.4% in Spring '06. The return rate went up 1.3%, from 56.7% in Spring '05 to 58% this year. The consent rate dropped 3.4%, moving from 55.3% last year to 51.9% this year. Response rates declined 1.4% in the top 10 Metros, going from 27.5% in Spring '05 to 26.1% in Spring '06. After Arbitron continued its response rate treatments for young male, black, and Hispanic households, the response rates in the 18 "targeted" low-response Metros surveyed in Spring '06 decreased only 0.6%, from 27.9% last year to 27.3% this year. As initially announced in March, Arbitron plans to improve response rates this fall by using additional initiatives, such as sending a pre-placement letter with \$1 enclosed to households in all markets.

The Corporation for Public Broadcasting named 11 more stations to qualify for funding for the fiscal year 2007 through its Radio Community Action Grant Program. The stations announced include KCLU/Thousand Oaks, CA, KDUR/Durango, CO, KRFC/Fort Collins, CO, KGLT/Bozeman, MT, KMFA/Austin, KMOJ/Minneapolis, WTIP/Grand Marais, MN, Kohn/Sells, AZ, WGDR/Plainfield, VT, WGVV-LP/Rock Island, IL, and WTMD/Towson, MD.

Clarke Ingram, car-drivin' Conclave regular and veteran programmer at Talk-Oldies WKHB-AM/Irwin, PA-Pittsburgh and WKFB-AM/ Jeaneatte, PA-Pittsburgh, has been promoted from his present PD status to the OM title. Ingram, whose widespread broadcasting career includes stints at crosstown WBZZ (B-94), WWSW (3WS), WHTX, and WJJJ as well as stops at WPXY/Rochester, KRQQ/Tucson, KZZP/Phoenix, and WHTZ (Z100/New York), arrived at his current stations in 2004.

The Ace & TJ Morning Show was joined yesterday by Will Ferrell, star of "Talageda Nights: The Ballad of Ricky Bobby," to discuss his movie's second #1 weekend at the box office. This was Ferrell's second visit to the WNKS/Charlotte- based syndicated show. Amidst filming in Charlotte, Ferrel appeared on the show as the hosts launched an onair quest entitled "Will Call." Ferrell confided on yesterday's show, "I feel like you guys were a good luck charm for us and the movie...I wanted to say thanks!" In response to the criticism the movie received from Christian critics, Ferrell stated, "Apparently, I'm Christ-ophobic...but all the jokes are on Ricky Bobby". While some accuse Ferrell of being racist toward Southern white males, Ferrell responded, "I'm a product of the white Southern male...it's just funny...it's kinda funny that people come up with this crazy stuff." Rumor: Will Ace & TJ make a TalenTrak appearance in October, or is that just crazy stuff?

Steve King and Johnnie Putman, Tribune Talk WGN-AM/Chicago overnight hosts and husband-and-wife pop culture mavens, celebrate their 5,000<sup>th</sup> broadcast this Thursday. After launching their first show in 1985, the two hosts will celebrate by featuring Rich "Svenoolie" Koz, the Ides of March's Jim Peterik and Bob Bergland, the New Colony Six' Ronnie Rice, guitar greats Les Paul, Duane Eddy, and Doyles Dykes, and the "real voices" of Mickey and Minnie Mouse.

**Fife Communications** AC KCVM (Mix 96)/ Waterloo/ Cedar Falls, IA morning show, hosted by **Jamie, Jim, and Judge**, raised over \$1,2000 contributing to their annual total of more than \$80,000 (thus far) to benefit **Jamie and Jim's Kids** charity, allowing chronically and terminally ill kids a visit to Disney world every year.
