

The Conclave Learning Conference announced that Radio & Records President and Publisher, Erica Farber, will be this year's recipient of the 2007 Rockwell Award to be presented at the Minneapolis Marriott City Center during "Conclave 007: For Your Ears Only." She will receive the award at the Arbitron Awards Luncheon on Friday, June 29th. The Rockwell Award, first awarded in 1989, is a lifetime achievement tribute to those who have contributed to the radio and record industry through achievement, inspiration and mentoring. "We've never forgotten the support Erica and R&R provided in the formative years of the Conclave, and I'm thrilled the Board is recognizing that special legacy with the awarding of this Rockwell," said Tom Kay, Conclave Executive Director (the TATTLER just loves writing in the third person!), and added, "This recognition is long overdue, as Erica becomes the first woman to be recognized with this prestigious award. To all of this, I can only say -It's about time!" Erica has become one of the industries most respected and influential businesswomen. During the early years of her career, she held positions at KRTH-FM, KABC-TV, and KIIS-AM in Los Angeles before going to WROR-FM in Boston and then to WXLO-FM in New York as vice president/general manager. She joined McGavren Guild Radio in 1980 and rose to executive vice president/radio development for the parent company, INTEREP. In 1992, she joined Radio & Records and assumed full publishing responsibilities in January 1995. However, it's her contributions to those around her that has had a major impact. She has been recognized for her works with the Southern California Chapter of AWRT – a 1996 Genii Award for Radio and a 1994 AWRT Industry Award. In April 2000, she received an American Broadcast Pioneer Award from the **Broadcasters Foundation**. The **Country Radio** Broadcasters honored her in June 2002 with the President's Award. She is consistently voted by the readers of Radio Ink Magazine as one of The Most Influential Women In Radio®, topping the list in 1999 and 2001. In 2003, the National Association of Broadcasters presented her with their prestigious National Radio Award. She is a Past Chairperson of the Broadcast Promotion and Marketing Executives and a past board member and Past President of the Country Radio Broadcasters, to name just a couple. Erica currently serves on The Radio Hall of Fame Advisory committee and the Southern California Radio Advisory Group of the Museum of Television & Radio and the AWRT. Erica is the current

Chairperson of the National Board of Governors for the March of Dimes Radio AIR Awards, board member of the Broadcasters Foundation, Broadcast Education Association, Vice-President-at-Large for the Society of Singers and was recently appointed to the Dean's Advisory Committee for Cal State Fullerton College of Communication. Until recently, Erica served on the Board of Directors of Arbitron, Inc. She's a current member of the Conclave's Executive Board. Alternative WKZX and Classic Rock WLUP have bid farewell to VP/ Programming Mike Stern and WLUP PD Tim Dukes. According to Emmis Regional VP Marv Nyren, "This is something we have been going through for about a month now, and I have been bouncing ideas off of President Rick Cummings and Jimmy Steal. They said 'go for it.' The truth is that we have been doing things the same way for 30 years, and that's wrong. Both Mike Stern and Tim Dukes are wonderful programmers, but we have two amazing brands in Q101 and The Loop, and we want to maximize our efforts as we prepare for PPM which will be here 11 months from now. We need a programmer that will help us put a strategic plan together and lead us into the new world of PPM. We are going to begin running these stations now, as if PPM was already here. This programmer will have great team assistance in Q101 APD/ MD Spike Eskin and WLUP APD/MD (and Conclave TalenTrak Trakmaster) Bill Klaproth. I've not talked to one person yet, but this new programmer for both stations will be a visionary leader and strategic planner. We need someone to manage these brands, who can run the golden thread through all of them tying the programming into the Internet, texting, marketing, promotion, and all manners of spreading the brands." Comment: Many in the biz have been offering the opinion that the firing of Mike and Tim was for budgetary considerations, what with Emmis' fiscal year ostensibly coming to a close at the end of this month. But I believe Marv's explanation. I think Emmis is doing some forward thinking, not just in preparation for the PPM but for all the other things to which Marv alludes: Internet, texting, marketing, etc. Marv was quoted earlier this week that he had characterized both Mike and Tim as "traditional programmers"...and successful ones, at that. It may be too early to say, but the Chicago firings might be pointing toward a movement by radio companies to find 'the next big thing'... the next breed of programmer. No matter what, it becomes more and more apparent that radio companies may have begun to let the industry know that solutions of the past may not be offering answers for the future. It would appear at least one of them intends to do something about it, even when it means allowing two of the sharpest "traditional" programmers in the Midwest walk away from the building. Prepare for the future. It's coming fast. And for a few...it's already here. And expect this topic to occupy a prime position in the Conclave Learning Conference's agenda this summer. - TK

The auction of **Air America Network** has been approved by the **U.S. Bankruptcy Court**. The first bid will be for \$4.25 million by **Stephen L Green**, a Northeast real estate giant. His financial support comes from **Rob Glaser's Democracy Allies LLC**. To compete, subsequent bids must begin at \$4.6 million with a deposit of 10%. Any bidding increases must come in \$50,000 increments, and the finale will be a sale hearing.

Back to the **Air America** saga, a gathering of creditors has filed objections to the sale of the network. According to the **Bloomberg News**, the complaint accuses **Stephen Green** of a "bait and switch," meaning they agreed to a sum of \$500,000 from the sale of the network, but found that Green's bid put other creditors ahead of them in receiving the proceeds of the sale, which would endanger the recovery of their portion of the sale.

President/CEO of NAB David Rehr sent FCC Chairman Kevin Martin a memo this week, concerned about a recent report from the New York Times on satellite radio interference with local radio signals, and demanded that the Commission call back the satellite devices that interfere with free radio frequencies. He noted that listeners are often exposed to lewd and unwanted programming from satellite radio. He noted "FM listeners in their cars and listeners of public and religious programming on noncommercial stations typically located at the lower end of the FM band."

Ammel was previously seen at Kalamazoo and Toledo stations, and also worked at WIQB/Ann Arbor. He starts February 19...CH Holdings Talk KTRS-AM/St. Louis welcomes more changes as morning jocks George Woods and Dana Daniels, as well as sports guy Tim Montemayor leave. KPLR-TV anchor Kathryn Jamboretz and former WVRV host Vic Porcelli take over mornings.

A study from **Arbitron** created last September, which demonstrated radio's ability to retain listeners during commercial breaks, is now available on compact disc. The study is a multi-media presentation entitled, "What Happens When The Spots Come On: The Impact of Commercial On the Radio Audience," and was co-authored by Coleman and Media Monitors. Anyone employed by a North American radio broadcaster has access to a free copy, and can have it mailed to their business address by ordering from Coleman's website, www.colemaninsights.com. Clear Channel has a deadline for bids on its "extra" properties set, and it's February 23rd by noon! The company is selling off the remainder of its stations, and has already filed several deals after announcing last

year its sale of 448 of its 1,150 properties. The company is going private after an \$18.7 billion buyout.

"I'm not a professional politician. I know I'm gonna make mistakes." This statement preceded the big announcement this week that Mr. Al Franken, Minnesota native, writer, comedian, thorn in the side of neocons everywhere, and former Conclave keynoter, will run for Minnesota State Senate against incumbent Republican Norm Coleman. Franken will of course run on the Democratic-Farm-Labor ticket. He made the announcement on the last remaining minutes of his last show. "I've decided to move on to another challenge," he told listeners, talking about his Minnesota roots and his founding of the "Minnesota Values Pac." He also spoke of his inspiration and admiration for the late Sen. Paul Wellstone. "I discovered I liked it," he said of his activities for the Party and his work for Pac in the 2006 elections. Franken informed his audience that he would be visiting a clinic for uninsured patients on Thursday, then leaving on a Minnesota state tour. He urged listeners to "keep listening, keep talking, keep doing." His website is now converted into a campaign website, and has links to volunteer and to contribute, as well as a video message from Franken. In the video, he states, "I'm not a typical politician. I've spent my career as a comedian. Minnesotans have a right to be skeptical about whether I'm ready for this challenge and to wonder how seriously I would take the responsibility that I'm asking you to give me. I want you to know: Nothing means more to me than making government work better for the working families of this state, and over the next 20 months I look forward to proving to you that I take these issues seriously." Thom Hartmann takes Franken's place at Air America.

Two-time **Conclave** keynoter **Mitch Albom**, host at **ABC** Talk WJR-Am/Detroit, **Free Press** columnist, will have his new best-seller adapted into a television film by **Oprah Winfrey's** production company. The book, "**For One More Day,**" will begin production this summer to be aired late this year on ABC. Winfrey, a big fan of Albom's work, also produced his "**Tuesdays with Morrie.**"

An \$8000 fine has been recommended by the FCC for Waitt Omaha LLC for EEO violations at Hot AC KQKQ/Council Bluffs-Omaha. The station did not retain all EEO documentation prior to the hiring of a new GM in March of 2004. The commission did not end there; there were several late-license renewal fines, including one for \$1500 for American Media Investments, Inc. in Deerfield, MO; \$7000 fines for Cornell College in Mount Vernon, IA; Board of Regents, Northwest Missouri State University in Chillicothe, MO; Wennes Communications Stations, Inc, for stations in Waukon and Decorah, IA; Grinnell College Trustees of Iowa in Grinnell; Central University of Iowa Central College in Pella, IA; and Ritenour Consolidated School District in Overland, MO.

Boone Biblical Ministries got slapped with a \$20,000 fine this week from the **FCC**. Southern Gospel KFFF-AM/FM/Boone, IA told the FCC that files for licensing has been misplaced and later recreated most of the content for the files. The license were renewed, but with a **Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture**.

Richard D. Stone's Stone Communications has made a switch with Roy E. Henderson's Fort Bend Communications. Stone's Talk WWKK-AM/Petoskey, MI, along with \$244,000, is traded for Classic Country WLDR-AM/Kingsley, MI.
