

The inductees into the National Radio Hall of Fame have been announced, and a diverse and amazing group of professionals are being honored this year in Chicago! MBC President Bruce DuMont stated, "This prestigious and diverse quintet was elected from a highly competitive field of nominees and we are excited to honor them. A nationally broadcast ceremony on November 3rd will spread word of their life-long accomplishments to radio lovers all across America." The 2007 inductees include Jerry Coleman, who has been broadcasting baseball for over 40 years; Jimmy Durante (deceased), a legendary vaudevillian turned 1940's radio comedian and singer known for his mangled English and raspy voice; Richard Durham (deceased), who wrote and produced the groundbreaking radio drama Destination Freedom; **Dan Ingram**, a rock radio pioneer who is considered by some to be the best Top 40 DJ of all time; and Marian McPartland, the host of Marian McPartland's Piano Jazz for more than 25 years on National Public Radio. Sean Hannity will be hosting the one-hour televised event on Saturday November 3 at 10pm (ET).

Minnesota Public Radio has received an emergency grant of \$25,000 from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting to help with coverage of the bridge collapse in Minneapolis. CPB Pres./CEO Pat Harrison stated in a memo to public stations, "Our thoughts go out to the people of Minnesota during this difficult time. One of the key aspects of responding to this tragedy is to keep people informed and this grant will help MPR continue to provide outstanding public service over the coming weeks." Commentary: The \$25,000 donation is but a small blip in the CPB annual revenue of over \$400 million. But that \$400 million is OUR money, donated via taxes (CPB calls it "Federal Appropriation"). How much did the federal government give commercial radio to cover last week's disaster? Didn't commercial channels strive to keep people informed? Were they no less deserving? Of course, commercial radio doesn't have - and shouldn't have - access to public monies. But if our government, via CPB, had an extra \$25,000 to contribute for "outstanding public service" during the tragedy...wouldn't it have made more sense to present that grant to our local Red Cross? Two words, CPB: Tacky and inappropriate - TK

Civil rights advocate and **2006 Conclave Learning Conference** keynoter **Rev. Al Sharpton** has called for a ban on racist and derogatory terms in rap lyrics, using a series of rallies as a platform for his cause across the U.S. **"The Day of Outrage"** rally included protests in New York, Los Angeles, Detroit, Houston, and Chicago. Sharpton stated, "The opposition has tried to use the argument of free speech, but they don't have the freedom to use peoples' pension funds against their own will and interest." However, **Clark McKinley**, a spokesman for the **Californian Public Employees Retirement System**, said their job was to "maximize returns, not make moral judgments."

Another Conclave keynoter got attention this week, as Jones Radio Networks' Neal Boortz got some surprise publicity on the Republican debate on Sunday. Candidates discussed his "The Fair Tax Book," during the debate, and during a heated exchange, candidate Tom Tancredo suggestion that Rudy Giuliani, who said he'd read the book, should go back and read it again!

This week, the **Emmis Communications** Board of Directors decided on a Common Stock buyback of \$50 million. The cash flow for these purchases will be financed through operations and borrowings in Emmis' credit facility. Emmis is based out of Indianapolis and headed up by **Jeff Smulyan.** In the past they've made at least two attempts to take the company private, although it's not yet clear if this will make that goal any easier.

More lawmakers are speaking out against the XM-Sirius merger. Sen. Claire McCaskill (D-Mo) has fired off a letter to FCC Chairman Kevin Martin and Assistant Attorney General Thomas Barnett, noting she "does not believe the merger is in the best interest of consumer," and raises the issue of Sirius and XM's failure to develop the promised interoperable receivers. Sen. Byron Dorgan (D-ND) has also added his voice to the cacophony as a member of the Democratic Policy Committee and member of the Senate Commerce Committee and Appropriations Committee. He has also written to Martin and Barnett, urging their rejection of the satellite radio merger. Dorgan's letter points out that XM and Sirius were "lucky" to win the licenses and now have "an obligation to serve the public in accordance with the market for audio new and entertainment."

Clear Channel Country KEEY/Minneapolis APD/MD Travis Moon is leaving after 12 years with the station. He's confirmed a move to Cincinnati, where he'll take on the PD role for Bonneville's Country duo WYGY and WUBE. He takes over for Marty Thompson, who exited the cluster last month. Moon will stay on at K102 until Friday, August 17, and will start in Cincy on Monday, August 27. Congrats, Travis!

Gem State Adventist Academy Christian AC KTSY/Boise held an emergency food drive fort he **Duck Valley Indian Reservation** on the Idaho/Nevada state line, after the reservation lost is power due to the huge wild fires running through the area. Over 1,800 people are without food and basic staples.





Radio For Milwaukee Variety WYMS/Milwaukee has launched "414 Music," a live in-studio performance interview program each week, featuring a new local band every show. 414 Music will air at 5 pm every Friday and be hosted by drive time jock Scott Mullins. The first band showcased in the feature will be The Dark Horse Project. Programming and Content Director Kedar Coleman commented, "414 Music mark RadioMilwaukee's latest approach to bringing the sound of Milwaukee musicians to our audience. Over the next few months, we'll continue to roll out new ways to promote Milwaukee musicians and help them reach new local and national listeners."

CBS Radio Alternative WKRI/Cleveland syndicated morning host – and 2005 TalenTrak keynoter - **Rover** hoped to catch **Barry Bonds**' recordbreaking 756th home run this week, and his wish was granted. Of course, if Rover had literally *caught* the home-run ball, a lucky listener would have won a million bucks from **Miller Lite**. Rover used his own money to travel to the game, and quipped, "My net worth isn't quite that high yet, and my home station 92.3 K-Rock is pretty cheap, so I'm thankful Miller stepped up to the plate with the cash."

The deal that had **Clear Channel** selling several clusters to **Chris Devine's Blue Point Media** has been terminated, according to a memo circulating this week. Devine was supposed to pay \$45.7 million for several stations in Idaho, Minnesota, Iowa, and Montana. He was also supposed to lay down \$16.5 million for 11 Wyoming stations. The memo also stated that Clear Channel will be looking for new buyers for the stations.

A brush fire that produced a large amount of smoke caused a 25-minute evacuation this week at **Clear Channel**/Denver. The smoke poured into the building via the HVAC system. But there were no casualties, and the station never left the air while the ordeal ensued.

College Creek Broadcasting, Inc., owned by Chris Devine, has been served with a default notice by the FCC for missing its final payment obligation for a new FM at Murdo, SD. It secured the deal in an FCC FM auction. Subsequently, College Creek loses the allocation and must pay an interim default payment of \$10,800, paid out of the deposit already on hold with the Commission. College Creek did pay its obligation towards another station won in the auction, but defaulted on the Murdo allocation.

Tribune Talk WGN-AM/Chicago has raised over \$131,000 for the **WGN Radio Neediest Kids Fund** on its first "720 Day" on July 20. The fundraiser lasted all day and the total included a 50% match by the **McCormick Tribune Foundation.**

Jason Knight is axed due to budget cuts at Max Media/ Mississippi River Radio Top 40 WCIL/Carbondale, IL...Erin McNamara has been promoted from Promotions Assistant to Promotions Director. She'll be overseeing the promotional activities of Classic Rock WGLO, Country WFYR, Active Rock WIXO, Top 40 WZPW, and Christian WVEL-AM...Minneapolis-based Amy Bowe has joined Sheet Happens Prep as an Affiliate Relations Manager. Serious issues were addressed this week on the topic of "cutting" (selfmutilation) on Olivet Nazarene University Christian T40 WONU/ Chicago. Afternoon drive hosts **Tower** and **Mallory** hosted a week of interviews with artists and experts on the topic. "We didn't just wake up one morning and decide to use pop radio to battle an epidemic," commented host **Seth "Tower" Hurd.** "We got a live call from a man who had just confronted his 17-year-old daughter for cutting. Once he told his story, we were immediately flooded with more calls. The two most shocking were from a 14-year-old who had started cutting when she was 12, and a 32-year-old who struggled with cutting after her daughter was born." The station continued to receive unsolicited calls and emails of support from listeners who had struggled with self-injury. The hosts spent the next two weeks booking interviews with artists who had written songs about the topic, including **Plumb**, **Skillet**, and **Seventh** Day Slumber. Also on the show during the week were Dr. Wendy Lader from the Chicago-based SelfInjury.com, and Jamie Tworkowski from the nonprofit To Write Love On Her Arms.

Will online streaming stations get more support from labels soon? With satellite radio now a friend of record labels, it might be on the horizon, and a trend worth watching at the level of terrestrial radio level. The CRB ruling a few weeks back that financially allowed many streaming stations to stay on the air gave <code>IPartyRadio.com</code> a reason to party! The site, along with <code>Robbins Entertainment</code>, is presenting a <code>Cascada</code> show at <code>618 Live On Water</code> in Downtown Milwaukee, and will be giving away dinner with <code>Cascada</code> and <code>VIP</code> passes to its all-ages show.

Friend of the Conclave and Main Street, Jo Interrante, shares: "On Saturday, August 5, over two dozen former employees and fans got together to munch, talk, joke, spin tales, and honor the genius who decided to create and launch 24-hour music formats via satellite, John Tyler." It all started in a little strip-mall in Mokena, IL in 1981 with two formats, AC and Country. By the end of the 80's, Satellite Music Network was re-situated in Dallas and had over 600 stations nationwide. SMN was acquired by ABC in the early '90's and by 2005 the format menu grew to a dozen formats. The crowd gathered to honor Tyler (by personality JJ Jordan) included George Williams, Mike Tyler, Patricia Harvey, Jack Bishop, Marty Raab, Jackie Mack, Bob Lawrence, John Hicks, Barry Probes, Bud Buschardt, Mark and BJ Edwards, Bob Bruton (sporting fuzzy tiger slippers!), Ralph Riley, Clark Tucker, Jo Interrante, Jerry Thomas, and Charlie Strickland.

Greenstone Media will close its doors on August 17. VP/Operations **Jim LaMarca** is currently working the phones and alerting affiliates. Many shows may still be around, stay tuned for updates.

A challenge to the license renewal of **Regent's** Top 40 KKSR/Sartell-St. Cloud has been rejected by the FCC. **Seth A. Neihardt**, a station employee who complained that the April 1, 2005 "Cash Dash" contest was not run substantially as announced or advertised, and that the filling of a job opening at the station was not properly represented in the station's EEO filing.

In other filing news, **Bloomfield Hills School District** has been granted a license renewal for its noncommercial WBFH/Bloomfield Hills, MI, over the objection and shared-time application of RB Schools and a challenge from **Superior Communications**, but a late license renewal operation after the expiration of its previous license, and public file violations drew the station a \$17,000 fine. RB continues to seek review of the earlier dismissal of its shared time application.

Armada Media Corp. just closed on a purchase of four stations in Watertown, SD, from Big Stone Broadcasting and Pheasant Country Broadcasting for \$2.9 million. Oldies daytimer KMSD-AM/Milbank, SD; Country KBWS/Sisseton, SD; and Country KDIO-AM and Classic Rock KPHR/Ortonville, MN are all included in the deal.

The syndicated racing show, "Speedfreaks," has been picked up in Milwaukee, where Entercom Sports WSSP-AM will air it Sunday 9-11 pm CT, starting this coming weekend. Said WSSP PD Ryan Maguire, "There has been a real clamoring for more racing content on WSSP. 'Sparky's Final Inspection' (Steve "Sparky" Fifer's local Saturday racing show), as well as our marketing partnership with the Milwaukee Mile Speedway, have been very successful. We're looking to add to that and Speedfreaks gives us a unique program that fans of all different types of motor sports can relate to."

Kurt was one of the original engineers who put WDAO/Dayton on the air in the mid-1960's; it was the first FM station in America to program exclusively to African-Americans. Other than WAVI/WDAO, he also engineered at WCIN-AM and WOKV/Hamilton-Cincinnati, WZIP/Cincinnati, and WDJX/Dayton, among others. Kurt is survived by his wife, Bonnie, and daughters Abbey and Libby.

He worked in several capacities for Clear Channel and it's preceding companies throughout the years. 2007 Conclave Learning Conference Begins Construction of New Industry. The building blocks for a dynamic rebuilding of the radio industry were laid during the weekend of June 28-July 1 at the 32nd annual Conclave Learning Conference, as hundreds of industry professionals, teachers and students descended upon the Minneapolis Marriott City Center for RADIO UNDER CONSTRUCTION. Over 40 sessions covering every major radio format, technology and resource were presented to packed meeting rooms throughout the conference weekend. THE TATTLER has been presenting stories about the event originally found on the pages and websites of the Conclave's Publicity Partners. Here's the next installment from Radio & Records. PPM World Programming (R.J Curtis for R&R) The recurring mantra from Gary Marince, VP of programming services and development for Arbitron, during a session titled "Programming Through The PPM Lens" at the 32nd Annual Conclave was "I have to hold listeners longer." Marince started by revisiting some ratings basics, reminding the audience that cume and TSL are the two critical functions of share, Marince then demonstrated how increasing either can grow the share, specifically pointing out that increasing weekly TSL by just one quarter hour, with no cume increase can improve share by one tenth of a point. Marince also gave an overview of PPM hardware, how panels are structured, and their stability. The hardware includes a signal encoder at the radio station, docking station for the home, and the actual meter. Ideally, PPM panelists participate for two years, although there is an average turnover of 10% each month. According to Marince, there is very strong panel stability, and he pointed out with the current diary system, a market like Houston has 4,120 in tab diaries per survey or roughly 343 per week. With the PPM, Marince says there are 1800 meters on the panel each day Additionally, PPM panelists have several rules they must adhere to: keep the meter with them at all times, keep the green light on, and recharge the meter during bed time. While the meter is in the docking station at night, listening habits recorded during the day are downloaded. The PPM also records all radio listening while in the docking station. If Arbitron detects a meter that has been docked for more than normal, they will contact panelists if this continues to happen Marince showed data from the Houston market that demonstrated how events drive spikes in listening. A specific example was a George Strait ticket giveaway on CBS Radio KILT. Each time the contest was conducted during the day, listening levels soared. While giving examples of how to hold listeners, Marince suggested the actual strategy for programming in the PPM world should be how not to lose them, again repeating the original mantra, "I have to hold listeners longer."
