

Internet advertising is ready to overtake radio ads for the first time. reminding broadcasters to be more mindful and aggressive with their online opportunities, according to Forbes. This year, U.S. radio ad spending is expected to inch up 1.5% in 2007, to \$20.4 billion, short of online ad spending, numbered at \$21 billion, up 22% from last year. Radio station websites and online audio advertising "will be the principal drivers for radio advertising growth" over the next several years. However, sluggish radio advertising will continue to experience slow growth, reaching around \$22.6 billion in 2011, while online ad spending is expected to be around \$44 billion. Terrestrial radio companies will have large audiences, but consumers are spending less time listening to radio than they do on the internet or on TV. Only 17% of U.S. consumers consider radio the "most" essential medium, down from 26% five years ago, according to Arbitron and Edison Media Research. The choice between radio and non-radio online ads won't be an eitheror proposition; studies show that consumer often listen to the radio while consuming other media and that a mix of terrestrial radio and online ads can be far more effective than online ads alone.

Cincinnati's public radio station WXVU will begin airing net radio station WOXY.com on one its HD side channels on Monday. GM Bryan Miller commented, "I see it as the perfect test run of a multicast channel to see what sort of legs it has. We have a built-in audience. There is a pent-up demand in the market for alternative rock." If successful, terrestrial radio programs will be able to program unique content off the Net for its HD format, which isn't catching on as expected. The action will be beneficial to both parties, who are ailing slightly. WOXY was defunct until a West Coast website invested, and HD has been showing slow growth compared to satellite radio and Net radio. Critics have pointed to the prevalence of jukebox-esque HD side channels as a reason for the falter. Cincinnati Public Radio CEO Richard Eiswerth explained, "Those who say it's another technological scam or gizmo are right, if the majority of stations are just doing what they normally do. It's going to be content that drives people to tune in and buy the radios. WOXY.com offers something different for a significant subset of the Cincinnati audience." Miller added, "Most of the innovation going on in the HD radio space is really being driven by public broadcasters. A lot of commercial broadcasters don't know what to do with it. I don't think

they are actually looking for more outlets for Net more programming. I think they want to produce less programming." According to reports, Eiswerth wanted to develop a business partner ship with WOXY.com that would include each station marketing memberships, contributions, and underwriting between the two.

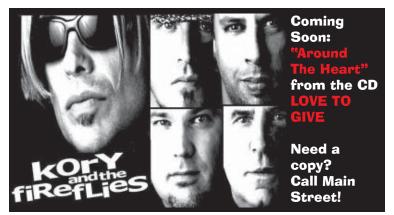
Two years after the conclusion of a contest at SBS Spanish WLEY-FM/ Chicago, three contestants have yet to receive their prizes, and are suing the station. Ernesto Hurtado was the winner of a car and a major-label recording contract, while Yolanda Chaidez and Luis Arreola were slated to receive recording time in a studio. Hurtado commented that "minutes after he was name the winner, a station employee whisked him into a back room, explained there would be no car but offered him gift certificates for clothes instead, all the while reassuring him that, eventually, a recording contract would come." Time passed and the station never awarded the prizes. The winners learned they could sue the station after hearing of another winner suing for non-payment of a prize. WLEY GM Jeff Shrinsky responded to the allegations saying, "The station is committed to meeting our obligations under the rules and regulations of every contest, and it has a stellar tract record of awarding prizes to listeners." He claims the station is looking into the case.

What's up with the radio trinity of Guy Zapoleon, Ben McConnell, and Charlie Cook? They are the first three people to appear on the new industry resource website, www.topsecretradio.com! The three pros, a consultant, marketing guru, and Programming Chief, respectively, have posted extensive interviews on the site, which is the newest creation from the Broadcast Barter Radio Networks. Co-founder Mike Noonan says, "We came up with the idea in the weeks leading up to the recent Conclave. We figured if radio people traveled across the country and internationally to learn from radio's top professionals, maybe they'd like to find out a little more about what makes these people tick for free and within the comforts of their own home or office." BBRN plans to post new interviews monthly or bi-monthly. In the coming weeks, you'll hear from Consultant Kevin Robinson, and the Pres./Publisher of All Access Music Group Joel Denver. The station may be sold to an independent third party, but will be operated by the trust until the sale so Cumulus can fit under present ownership caps.

Four Nebraska stations are leaving the hands of **NRG Media** to new owners **Armada Media Corp.** for \$4.5 million. Included in the deal is Talk KODY-AM and Country KXNP/North Platte; Oldies KUVR-AM and Adult Hits KMTY/Holdredge. **Kalil and Co.** represented **NRG** in the sale and **American Media Services** repped Armada.

A settlement has been reached in the legal battle between **Calvary Chapel of Twin Falls** Pastor **Mike Kestler**, and the founder of **Calvary Chapel**, Costa Mesa, CA-based **Chuck Smith. CSN International**, a Smith family property, will transfer 25 stations and three FM translators to Calvary Chapel of Twin Falls for \$200,000 plus FM translators K210DZ/Willits, CA, and K210DQ/Laytonville, CA. In the suit, Kestler claimed that Smith backed a sexual harassment case against Kestler in order to get control of the radio operation from the Idaho church.

2007 Conclave Learning Conference Begins Construction of New Industry. The building blocks for a dynamic rebuilding of the radio industry were laid during the weekend of June 28-July 1 at the 32nd annual Conclave Learning Conference, as hundreds of industry professionals, teachers and students descended upon the Minneapolis Marriott City Center for RADIO UNDER CONSTRUCTION. Over 40 sessions covering every major radio format, technology and resource were presented to packed meeting rooms throughout the conference weekend. THE TATTLER has been presenting stories about the event originally found on the pages and websites of the Conclave's Publicity Partners. Here's the next installment from *Radio & Records*. Hanging With The Home Team (by Keith Berman) For the top 40 format symposium at the Conclave, R&R's Kevin Carter enlisted Clear Channel Top 40 KDWB/Minneapolis PD Rob Morris, morning guy Dave Ryan and MD Lucas, along with former KDWB PD Mark Bolke as faculty members for the session. After an audio montage of KDWB's past, the panel discussed some of the station's history and how they arrived at KDWB. That led to conversation about how new people transition into a station, as well as how co-workers manage relationships when one is promoted into a position of leadership. After talking about Ryan's search for a new morning co-host, the panel discussed up-andcoming radio talent and where it's coming from. The discussion then turned back to the past, as Ryan and Morris reminisced about former PD Dan Kieley. Each panelist offered insights into his unique perspective and history: Bolke related what it's like to listen to radio as a nonprogrammer, Ryan told audience members to be patient and not try so hard when replacing a veteran talent, and Lucas discussed how blogs and social-networking sites like MySpace are allowing him and other talent to interact easily with listeners while doing their shows. Taking questions from the audience, Morris advised up-and-coming PDs to keep up with the changes in the industry and to network, as well as to become "listener advocates." Discussing top 40's infamous 10-year cycle, all involved said that music does drive the station and the ratings, but it's important to keep the station well-branded to keep it going during the down parts of the cycle.
