The FCC finds out February 29th if the Supreme Court will hear its case over their authority to fine TV stations for the broadcast of the F-word under federal indecency laws. Four of nine votes are needed to ensure the court's review. The FCC denied the appeal of ABC owned stations and their affiliates for the February 23rd, 2003 airing of **NYPD Blue** which showed a woman's bare butt. The FCC gave 40 affiliates until February 21st – only 52 hours from the appeal denial - to pay the \$27,500 fine. At the same time, it cancelled the fines to one dozen other stations. Reasons for the cancellation range from the expiration of a stature of limitation, to the fact that no one in the affiliates' market complained about the episode. The FCC rejected arguments that it gave the affiliates insufficient time to appeal the ruling; the stations noted that they only had 17 days to file their appeal, when the usual time is 30 days. The Commission doesn't have to give 30 days. What if the stations refuse to pay the fine? Well, then the FCC would have to go to district courts in each station's market to try to force them to pay up.

The FCC's rules about airing phone calls also apply to voicemail. The FCC issued a \$4,000 fine against **Courier Communications**, license holder for WNOV-AM for a February 2007 incident in which the cell phone voicemail greeting of then WISN-AM morning show producer **Keith Conrad** was played over the air without his permission on **Michael McGee's** "Word Warriors" show.

It's already been a year since the merger announcement of **XM/Sirius** and the **National Association of Broadcasters** has asked the FCC to block satellite radio providers from offering local broadcasting in hopes of gaining an edge for terrestrial radio. The NAB points out that both Sirius and XM have an alleged record of "misbehavior" in following FCC rules and should be banned from abusing local stations. According to NAB claims, both Sirius and XM have admitted to unauthorized or misused antennas and repeaters. The NAB has also admitted that it hopes to block other expansion moves that would provide access to satellite radio in areas which satellite radio is normally unavailable, such as Sirius' plans to install repeaters in Alaska or Hawaii. The association has often contended that a Sirius and XM union would constitute a monopoly that provides an unfair advantage against land-based radio.





Santita Jackson has been suspended as midday host at Midway Talk WVON-AM in a dispute over Black History Month features. Jackson, 44, eldest daughter of the Rev. Jesse L. Jackson, has been off the air since Friday with no explanation to listeners. GM Melody Spann Cooper would confirm only that Jackson was off for the rest of the month. "I respect Santita, I love Santita, and I look forward to her coming back on March 1st," Insiders said the twoweek suspension was the culmination of ongoing tension at the station. The blowup occurred, sources said, when Jackson was asked to record a series of biographical vignettes for Black History Month. She agreed to do so, but when she asked that they air only on WVON, a heated exchange with Cooper ensued. Jackson declined to comment on details of the incident, saying: "I have the highest regard for the management of the station and the legacy of WVON. I look forward to returning to the air at the beginning of March."

New Average Quarter Hour (AQH) guidelines set by MediaBase for becoming reporters to their charts have been announced. Mediabase will also expand its Activator platform. Activator reporters are stations in Arbitron rated markets 151-300 that report weekly airplay. Mediabase President Rich Meyer commented, "As markets become more competitive and fragmented, we've seen a noticeable shift in audience shares. Mediabase has always had a policy of being inclusive rather than exclusive. We have adjusted our AQH minimums for reporting status so they are reasonable and attainable." Stations will continue to be required to have one full book in format before becoming a reporter. Stations must not fall below the AQH minimum for more than one book to remain reporters. Meyer added, "Mediabase recognizes the importance of stations in all rated markets and is very pleased to be expanding this platform in 2008. There are some enormously successful small market stations and we want the entire industry to be able to view this data on a weekly basis."
