**Rita Cosby To Keynote AT THE CROSSROADS!** Today the Conclave announced that author and Emmy winning journalist **Rita Cosby** will keynote at Conclave '08: At the Crossroads scheduled for June 26-29 in Minneapolis. Best known for her work at Fox News and most recently MSNBC, Cosby has also been in the headlines with her

controversial tell-all book about Anna Nicole Smith. She'll address Conclave attendees on Saturday morning, June 28th. If you're a Conclave devotee, you know that over the years, the Learning Conference has strived to bring keynote speakers from different sectors of the media. Through her affiliations with Fox and MSNBC, Rita Cosby brings a history ranging from conflict-ridden story reporting to interviews with notorious world leaders and social icons. A controversial figure herself, she's not afraid to speak her mind. Cosby has interviewed world leaders, conducting historic back to back interviews with Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat and Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon. She was the first reporter to see prisoners held at Guantanamo Bay and even interviewed Serbian president Slobodan Miloaevi - who called her from his prison cell at the Hague. She also made national headlines for her interviews with boxer Mike Tyson, the King of Pop Michael Jackson, and convicted serial killer David Berkowitz, "The Son of Sam." Last fall, she released a book - Blonde Ambition: The Untold Story Behind Anna Nicole Smith's Death - that was so controversial it was met with law suits before its ink was dry! Earlier today, Citadel announced fourth-quarter net revenues more than doubled with the addition of the ABC Radio operations, jumping from \$114 million to \$245.5 million, but net loss widened from \$1.1 million to \$848 million (1 cent to \$3.24/share). Pro forma revenues fell 5.1% to \$258.5 million, attributed to lower revenues in the San Francisco, Washington, Chicago, Atlanta, New York, Birmingham, Dallas, and Los Angeles clusters. In a statement issued with the financial report, Chairman/CEO Farid Suleman said, "The fourth quarter and the year ended December 31, 2007 was difficult for the broadcasting industry and the Company. The performance of the larger market radio stations acquired in the ABC Merger was particularly disappointing. Whereas the Company continues to believe that the long-term prospects from these stations will be positive, the Company in the interim is completing a major restructuring of these stations to both improve short-term profitability as well as position them for future growth." The restructuring referenced by Suleman was immediately manifest at all Citadel properties - even those in Minneapolis and Detroit, markets that had not suffered lowered revenues like others inside the Citadel world. So far, here's what's known. In Atlanta, 12 of the 15 on-air staff were dismissed. In DC, long-time smooth jazz outlet WJZW flipped to oldies with all the jazz jocks fired. In New York and LA, many longtime employees of WABC and KLOS have been let go. In Minneapolis, three staffers reputedly left the building.

Clear Channel Talk WLW/Cincinnati host and Premiere Radio Networks weekender Bill Cunningham was warming up a crowd for Republican Presidential candidate John McCain when he called Democratic Presidential candidate Barack Obama "a hack, Chicago-style Daley politician who is picturing himself as change. When he gets done with you, all you're going to have in your pocket is change." Cunningham said that the media would at some point "peel the bark off Barack Hussein Obama" and talk about Obama's relationship with Tony Rezko, the indicted fundraiser. McCain apologized for Cunningham's remarks and said, "I did not know about these remarks, but I take responsibility for them. I repudiate them. My entire campaign I have treated Sen. Obama and Sen. Clinton with respect. I will continue to do that throughout this campaign." He said that he did not hear the comments and does not know Cunningham. For his part, Cunningham, complaining that McCain "threw me under the bus to the national media," said that he would endorse Hillary Clinton.

## **Jupiter Rising WIBT/Charlotte 57x!**

Former WLS-AM/Chicago and WDTW-AM/Detroit talk host Nancy Skinner announced Monday that she has pulled out of the race for Congress in Michigan citing the need for "enormous resources to beat an incumbent," Rep. Joe Knollenberg (R-MI). Skinner, who lost to Knollenberg in 2006's election, will return to her consulting business, Skinner Communications. Meanwhile, CBS News WBBM-AM/Chicago Bears pre- and post-game show co-host and former player Jim Schwantz announced that he will run for mayor of Palatine, IL in Spring 2009, challenging longtime incumbent Rita Mullins in the non-partisan election.

Four former Entercom Classic Rock KYYS/KC personalities are alleging age discrimination against the company, and have filed a complaint with the EEOC. Former morning team Max Floyd and Tanna Guthrie, midday talent Traci Wilde (Martens), and afternoon host Slacker (Brian Adams) told the EEOC that their firings last month (when the station flipped to AAA as KBLV -99.7 The Boulevard) were based on their ages (Floyd Is 67, Guthrie 51, Martens 41, & Adams 43). In their complaint, the four say that the format did not change and that their replacements had identical job descriptions for the jobs they held. Market Manager David Alpert said that the station's ratings had declined, forcing the format change, and "We wish Max, Tanna, Traci, and Slacker future success and are disappointed that they intend to pursue litigation. We are confident that our decisions regarding the launch of the new radio station, The Boulevard, were fair, and we are prepared to defend them."

The **RIAA** is planning on having a handful of artists mingle with Congress next week about installing a performance royalty fee on terrestrial radio. The NAB is hard at work, challenging the label lobby to a public debate over "fairness." NAB EVP Dennis Wharton issued the following statement: "We welcome the debate over which side has been more 'fair' to artists - radio stations or RIAA-member companies. America's hometown radio stations expose and promote musicians to 232 million listeners every week. Contrast that with decades-long exploitation of artists by foreign-owned record labels, demonstrated just this month in a \$6 million lawsuit against Universal Music Group for 'cheating' artists like Count Basie and Benny Goodman out of royalties." No time or place for such a debate was proposed. *However, you* WILL be able to see and hear this issue be debated on stage at the 33<sup>rd</sup> Conclave Learning Conference AT THE CROSSROADS on Friday, June 27th as a part of the All Access-sponsored Conclave College!

Westwood One announced that it and funds managed by The Gores Group, LLC, a private equity firm headquartered in Los Angeles, CA, have executed a purchase agreement pursuant to which Gores will make an equity investment of up to \$100 million in Westwood One. The full investment is subject to the conditions contained in the purchase agreement, including the closing of the pending agreements between Westwood One and CBS Radio Inc. and approval by shareholders.

Conservative Talker Sean Hannity has cancelled his upcoming appearance at CRS-39 (Country Radio Seminar) next week according to his PD, Phil Boyce. A statement released by Boyce said, "Due to the rapidly changing events of this year's Presidential primary season, and the magnitude of the Texas and Ohio primaries the night before this event, Sean Hannity has been forced to cancel his appearance as the keynote speaker for the Country Radio Seminar in Nashville on March 5th. Sean deeply regrets the conflict, and any inconvenience or disappointment this may cause." CRB President Ed Salamon responded: "We are in the process of finalizing a presentation for the keynote slot which will focus on a hot button industry issue, and expect to be able to announce it early next week. With everything that has happened in the Radio and Music industry since the last Country Radio Seminar, our problem has not been finding topics to address, but finding time to cover everything necessary." CRS-39 starts Wednesday, March 5th and runs through Friday, March 7th at the Nashville Convention Center.

**Greater Media** Active Rock WRIF/Detroit HD outlet RIFF 2 has partnered with <u>Ourstage.Com</u> to launch an online battle of the bands that will have one local Detroit band walking away with \$1,001, HD radio for a month and the chance to win \$5,000. Interested bands can go online to <u>riff2.com</u> through March 23<sup>rd</sup> to enter. They will be asked to complete a free registration with Ourstage.Com and then upload up to two audio tracks to be entered into the competition. There are three rounds of voting to determine the local winner of the Riff 2 Detroit Battle of the bands. "We're excited about the technology that Ourstage.Com brings to this competition and are looking forward to hosting a true, local online battle of the bands," said RIFF 2 PD **Mark Pennington**.

**Prometheus Radio Project** and **Media Access Project** are taking another run against the **FCC**'s proposed changes to the cross-ownership rules, filing an appeal in federal court to get the new rules thrown out. The appeal, filed with the **U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit**, looks to block the Commission from relaxing the rules to allow more common newspaperbroadcast ownership. Prometheus and MAP were the plaintiffs in the case that got a previous FCC ownership rules revision thrown out in the same circuit.


