

New York Gov. Eliot Spitzer's resignation takes effect Monday March 17th after revelations surfaced regarding his past with prostitution. Spitzer didn't mention anything about hookers when he held his press conference saying only, "I am deeply sorry I did not live up to what was expected of me." Spitzer's lawyers have been in discussions with the US attorney's office in New York trying to negotiate a plea deal to avoid prosecution. According to the New York Post, Spitzer's use of prostitutes date back 10 years and he has allegedly spent near \$80,000. NPR is reporting that Federal prosecutors may charge Spitzer with an obscure law from 1910 called the Mann Act. Passed during a "moral panic" the law was designed to fight forced prostitution although critics say it has been used as a tool of political persecution and even blackmail. Several celebrities have been charged with violating the Mann Act including: Charlie Chaplin, Frank Lloyd Wright, Chuck Berry and Jack Johnson. Comment: It's been great fun inside of our industry (much like it probably has been inside Wall Street and the insurance industry) to rejoice in the downfall of Spitzer. It's been hard for me to refrain from the pile-on, as well. After all, my 'hobby' vocation as a music promoter for Main Street suffered greatly after the revelations of then New York AG Spitzer caused a dramatic altering in the relationship of radio and records. The fact remains, members of both industries behaved as stupidly as Client #9 did, and were caught just as guiltily in the practice of their criminal wrong-doing. Having Spitzer go down as he did won't change those facts of history. However, I can revel in one thing associated with his scandal: he had the common decency of staying out of the Minneapolis-St. Paul airport to conduct his dalliance! - TK

Staff cuts in Chicago at Citadel's WLS-AM and WZZN-FM has Chicago Sun-Times media columnist Robert Feder livid, calling the cutbacks the work of "idiots and incompetents who've been destroying radio." Feder sharpened his attacks saying, "The villain this time was **Citadel Broadcasting Corp.** CEO **Farid Suleman**. who made a lousy deal to buy the stations and now appears determined to wreck them in order to save face and pay down his crushing debt." Feder didn't stop there, continuing on to say, "Before he blundered into Citadel, Suleman used to be a bean counter and hatchet man for Mel Karmazin at the former Infinity Broadcasting. Suleman obviously learned little from his mentor, who appreciated the value of talented personalities to a successful radio product." According to Feder, the news operation at WLS has been destroyed and the station should stop promoting itself as the place to go for news. Added Feder, "Speculation has been heating up that Suleman could force WLS to replace (its morning show) with Don Imus, whose New York-based morning show was resurrected by Citadel last year. If WLS loses its local morning show to syndication, it could be the last nail in the coffin for The Big 89."

Saturday Night Live vet and 2005 Conclave Learning Conference Keynoter, Al Franken's challenge to the Minnesota Senate seat held by Republican Norm Coleman has just gotten easier. Franken was facing a tough challenge for the 2008 Democratic nomination by Mike Ciresi, but not any longer because Ciresi has withdrawn. It was a battle of Franken's celebrity-fueled fundraising v. Ciresi's personal fortune, which Franken appeared to be winning. Franken isn't the nominee yet, he still has to contend with a college professor, Jack Nelson-Pallmeyer, before earning the right to take on Coleman.

Arbitron will implement diary enhancements that are intended to improve response rates for hard to reach demographics, called the "Second Chance Diary." Beginning with the Spring 2008 diary survey, all continuously measured markets will offer a second chance to respondents in households who initially agree to participate, but fail to return their diaries. During the test run, 40% of households who agreed to participate for a second-time returned diaries... "This is the best of both worlds for diary sample improvements," said VP/Research Policy and Communication Ed Cohen. "Typically when you improve proportionality, response rates go down and vice versa. With the second-chance diary system, we are able to improve both proportionality and response rates." Also this Spring, Arbitron is expanding promised incentive to non-continuously measured markets where the male 18-34 proportionality index is less than 60, averaged across the most recent two surveys. At recruitment, households with young males are promised an additional premium for each returned diary. Promised incentives have been successfully implemented in the top-10 markets for black and Hispanic persons 12+ in Fall 2002 and has been expanded to additional markets.

Cumulus Media had an SEC filing yesterday to note that the company has received the necessary consent from the lender group under its existing credit agreement that would allow it to enter into an amendment to permit a merger. Members of the lending group holding in excess of 50% of the debt required to enter into an amendment gave their consents. The management-led merger would be with an investment group led by its Chairman/Pres./CEO Lewis W. Dickey Jr. and an affiliate of Merrill Lynch Global Private Equity, part of Merrill Lynch. This is not a done deal yet as merger completion remains subject to various conditions. Some conditions include approval by shareholders, FCC approval, and other customary closing conditions. The original buyout price was \$11.75. On last look, shares were up more than 12% at \$5.51, and the 52-week trading

range is \$4.90 to \$11.74. On last look, the company had roughly 345 radio stations in 67 U.S. markets. Its market cap as of today is \$238 million.

30 Under 30 Returns to the Conclave Learning Conference! Alleged mismanagement at the FCC has intensified a congressional investigation as they request documents dating back three years. In a letter, Rep. John D. Dingell (D-MI), chairman of the House Committee on Energy and Commerce, and other ranking members of the Subcommittee on Oversight asked FCC Chairman Kevin J. Martin to provide e-mails, memos, handwritten notes and meeting schedules. The subcommittee is probing how the agency conducted its open meetings, how it circulated items among the four other commissioners and how it put together reports, such as a controversial report on cable programming sales. Dingell's office said the bipartisan investigation has broadened in scope, "Based on the information we've collected so far, this document request represents the areas that we believe warrant further investigation," Martin has been criticized for his secretive style and has been accused of dragging his feet on issues in order to push through his own agenda. Martin is in Thailand for the International Telecommunication Union's annual symposium and wasn't available to comment. Mary Diamond, an FCC spokeswoman, said in response to the letter, "We look forward to continuing to cooperate with the committee."

FCC Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein – 2005 Conclave Learning Conference Keynoter – and fellow Commission-member Deborah Taylor Tate will appear at the NAB Show 2008's "Regulatory Face-Off" panel in Las Vegas on April 15th. The annual panel gives attendees the chance to hear the Commissioners speak on issues facing the broadcasting industry.



Promised action is underway on Capitol Hill as cases head to the courts regarding the FCC decision to allow local broadcast/ print cross-ownership in the top 20 markets. Byron Dorgan (D-ND) forges ahead with the Resolution of Disapproval tactic that if passed would prevent the FCC from enforcing the new rules. ". "The FCC says this is a modest compromise, but make no mistake, this is a big deal. When nearly half of the people in this country are told that in their cities and towns the media will get the green light to consolidate, they will not be happy," Dorgan said. "The proposal would also create a greatly relaxed approval process for newspapers to buy TV stations in any U.S. media market and spur a new wave of media consolidation in both large and small media markets." Dorgan continued, "Our nation is best served when we have access to a variety of media sources. Smaller and independent media outlets across the country provide local news that simply would not exist if large media conglomerates continue their consolidation efforts."

Legendary programmer **Lee Abrams** is leaving XM Satellite Radio to join **Tribune Company** as its first-ever Chief Innovation Officer. "Lee's going to pump new life into our content, re-energize our brands, and get people thinking and working together like they never have before," declared Tribune President of Broadcasting and Interactive **Randy Michaels**. "He invented the modern FM radio format, got satellite radio off the ground when no one gave it a chance, and managed to advise on the redesign of 'Rolling Stone' magazine and the launch of TNT Cable Network in his spare time," Michaels noted. Abrams will be responsible for innovation across publishing, broadcasting and interactive divisions. Abrams first day is April 1st.

Sirius Satellite Radio CEO Mel Karmazin said he hopes US regulators would rule by the end of March on the proposed merger of Sirius and XM Satellite Radio. Karmazin said he "took heart" about recent comments by FCC Chairman Kevin Martin but cautioned since the \$4.2 billion merger of the two satellite radio companies had taken longer than expected. The companies had hoped to get the go-ahead by the end of 2007.

After almost 15 years, a new **PBS** station will finally sign on in Indianapolis. WITT is expected to air on 91.9 FM with 6,000 watts from a tower based in Boone County. The station will be run primarily by community volunteers.

Midwest Active Rock KRBR/Duluth, MN is tweaking to a more mainstream format and changing its moniker and calls to KHQG 102.5 "The Hog." OM **Jack Lawson** clarifies, "We're still playing currents at the same frequency that we have over the last several weeks, but we've moved some of the harder active titles to nights and expanded our day categories to include more mainstream gold.

Positive Impact Media Christian CHR KZZQ/Des Moines is now KPUL (Pulse 99.5). KZZQ went dark on Friday, February 29th and KPUL signed on Tuesday(3/11). The station will be "music containing messages of truth" and their songs will have to contain at least one of three qualities: a message of transcendence, message of significance and a message of community.

Gapwest Broadcasting Alternative KPPC/Idaho Falls-Pocatello, ID changed call letters to KEGE to match its Edge moniker.

Last weekend, **Hubbard Broadcasting** Hot AC KSTP/ Minneapolis listeners raised over \$841,000 in their "KS95 for Kids Radiothon." To date, KSTP has raised over \$10.3 million to benefit local charities Gillette **Specialty Health Care** and **The Children's Cancer Research Fund**.
