USA Today reports that “members of **Congress**, already bruised by the struggles over the health care overhaul, had better get ready for another bitter fight, this time over the future of the music business.” The **Senate Judiciary Committee** cleared a Performance Rights bill last Thursday and the **House Judiciary Committee** approved a similar bill back in May. Not much room or hope of compromise because “record companies want the change because they’re running out of money,” said **NAB** Board Chairman and CEO of **Commonwealth Broadcasting Steve Newberry**. “When you start with that basis, it’s very difficult to engage in good-faith negotiations. If a large station is paying hundreds of thousands of dollars a year in fees, they’re going to play the performers who are most proven to get a return on investment.” “If you use somebody’s work to make a buck, you should compensate them for it,” says **MusicFirst’s Martin Machowsky**. *Comment: Newberry’s quote in the USA Today article may be the first time the word ‘negotiation’ has been used in the radio/royalties debate. You may remember when Newberry and former NAB CEO David Rehr visited the Conclave one summer ago to participate in the royalties debate, Rehr promised no compromising would occur in the fight. While a bit backhanded, Newberry’s quote carries an implication that the door may be open, albeit just a crack, for the two parties – radio and musicians – to talk about the possibility of common purposes ... something that hasn’t been a feature of this dispute, ever. But one wonders if the contentiousness has carried on too long to allow common sense to re-enter the fray. - TK*

Last month, you may remember that leading radio broadcasters announced their commitment to including song tags inside broadcast programming on FM stations. The announcement came in conjunction with **Microsoft’s** announcement of a new set of features for all **Zune** portable media players that takes

advantage of the built-in FM radio tuner to let people instantly tag and retrieve songs broadcast from any song tagging-enabled FM radio station.

Now, this summer’s Learning Conference keynoter **RAB CEO Jeff Haley** is asking about the state of that commitment via a questionnaire he delivered to 80 radio CEOs. Haley’s message: “Radio has long enjoyed a position as the number one source for new music discovery. Recent products launched by Apple and Microsoft are a testament to our success and the enduring strength of Radio. The broader distribution of the FM signal on mobile devices will change Radio misperceptions and drive more listeners. Our next opportunity will be to drive greater listener satisfaction through the direct purchase of music from our programming (TATTLER underline). Device manufacturers and telcom carriers will be key partners to help broaden our distribution and make interactive commerce happen from our broadcasts. As consumer adoption of this evolves, there are many other opportunities including incremental revenue streams and interactive advertising. I believe it is imperative for our industry to more broadly adopt RDS RT+ radio text functionality... It is my hope that we rapidly adopt this platform and tie listenership and digital music purchasing more closely together.” *Comment: Is it possible that song-tagging may be the long-sought catalyst that ultimately allows the radio and music industries to land on potentially common ground in the radio-royalty issue (see comment above)? Stranger things have happened.- TK*

The **Obama** administration declares **Fox News Channel** is NOT a news organization. In response, **Salem Radio Networks** VP/ News and Talk Programming **Tom Tradup** sent a letter to President Obama, inviting him to appear as a guest-host on any of Salem’s syndicated talk shows. Tradup’s letter to the **White House** expressed surprise that the President characterized FOX News as “basically...talk radio.” The letter continues, saying, “The President may not fully grasp the compelling nature of talk radio and why it has become the undisputed #1 format in American radio...no Teleprompters, no staff to hand him papers... We anticipate the President will welcome this opportunity to make history... This, truly, will be ‘change we can believe in.’” *Comment: We’re not sure which is the sillier notion. That an administration go to war with a media outlet. Or having a syndicator request the President as host for one of its talk shows. Still, it’s nice to have radio attract so much national attention, even if it’s coupled with TV. If, as we heard this week, radio is simply television without the pictures... then it should be equally obvious that television is radio without the imagination. - TK*

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Congrats to **Midwest Communications** Top 40 WIFC/Wausau, WI for raising over \$23,500 for Aspirus Cancer Care during their 12 annual "Disco Cures Cancer" event.

Despite the "Cash for Clunkers" program, **Colorado Public Radio** announces a sharp upturn in the number of used cars donated to the station. CPR collected 326 cars in the last fiscal year, up from 186 the previous year. CPR's fall pledge drive enabled the company to beat its annual \$1.6 million goal with 7,064 pledges totaling \$851,663, an increase over last years 5,856 pledges totaling \$746,326.
