Can donations to a public radio station create a charitable trust to block the sale of that station? That's the argument a threejudge panel of the Minnesota Court of Appeals heard this week. The case was filed by a listener group, SAVEWCAL against St. Olaf College's sale of noncomm WCAL/Northfield, MN in 2004. The station was sold to Minnesota Public Radio in 2004, dropping its Classical format and flipping to MPR's AAA "The Current" format with the new calls of KCMP. SAVEWCAL Pres. Ruth Sylte said, "We're trying to wake up the courts and wake up the public about what donor intent means and what are the rights of donors." The group argues that donations create a trust that require the charity to not do anything against the donors' intent.

Emmis' classic hits, K-HITS 96/St. Louis' announced a major shake-up earlier this week in its daily programming. Effective immediately, *The Showgram*, K-HITS morning talk show, will be discontinued and replaced with an all-music format hosted by St. Louis radio veteran Rick Sanborn. Changes are also being made to the station's late afternoon show. Long-time station personalities Katy Kruze and Carl "the Intern" Middleman have been let go. Always-controversial J. C. Corcoran was also removed from the air, but remains under contract with Emmis Radio until December 2010. Showgram personalities John Ulett and Laurie Mac will remain in mornings on K-Hits with Rick Sanborn. "These changes are designed to give our listeners what they want, namely more classic rock, all day, every day," said **John Beck**, Emmis senior vice president and General Manager. "At a time when our industry is suffering due to the economic recession, it is critical that we find ways to boost our ratings. Playing more music in the morning than any other station in the market is one way we feel we can differentiate ourselves and attract even more listeners." "I have nothing but good things to say about J.C., Katy and Carl," said Beck. JC in particular is a storied and historic personality in St. Louis radio who has done groundbreaking work for years. We will miss him on the air. JC has worked very hard to make this work. Unfortunately, ours is a business driven by ratings, and those ratings indicate that we need to change in order to compete successfully in this environment." Beck added he does not anticipate any further personnel changes in the foreseeable future.



The **Topeka City Council** rejected **Morris Communications**Talk WIBW-AM/Topeka host **Raubin Pierce's** bid to join the **Topeka Planning Commission**. The Commission voted 5-4 to block the appointment and also approved a resolution calling Pierce "unqualified" for the position. Pierce has been a staunch critic of city officials for several years. Mayor **Bill Bunten** appointed Pierce to the Commission last month, drawing a fierce response from his opponents on the Council. Councilman **Jeff Preisner**, who sponsored the anti-Pierce resolution, refused to say his reasons for doing so, referring the question to the legal department.

The FCC filed reply comments in the "fleeting expletives" indecency case before the US Court of Appeals for the 2nd Circuit, defending its determination that the words used by Cher and Nicole Richie on FOX telecasts of the Billboard Music Awards were, in fact, over the line. "Fox is left with no basis for challenging the Commission's determination that the broadcasts violated longstanding federal prohibitions against broadcasting indecent material." The Commission reminded the courts of the FCC's longstanding position that broadcasting's pervasive nature and unique accessibility to children justify regulating content, adding broadcasters get their spectrum space for free.

Mancow Gets (Ex-)Cited!



Earlier this week, Illinois Secretary of State, Jesse White, presented WLS/Chicago's Mancow Muller a proclamation commemorating the host's one-year anniversary back on the air in Chicago. One year ago this week, Mancow hit the air Where Chicago. In middle of 2006, Mancow was taken off the air in Chicago, but continued to host his nationally-syndicated morning show. He re-surfaced at WLS a year ago.

Wells Fargo analyst Marci Ryvicker predicts another round of cost-cutting coming soon to radio. "Based on Q3 results and various pre-announcements reported by some traditional media companies thus far, we expect most pure-play broadcasters to report revenue declines similar to or slightly better than Q2, which was down 15-20%. Cost cuts are also likely to be substantial, resulting in potential beats to the bottom line." The comments were made during a projection on CBS, in which Ryvicker said, "Given various positive comments made by management coupled with a healthier-than-expected scatter market, we anticipate CBS to at least meet, and potentially succeed, Q3 expectations of 22 cents."

Country Radio Broadcasters Exec. Dir. Ed Salamon exits. Salamon joined the CRB in 2002, replacing Paul Allen, after enjoying a long career in broadcasting. Most recently he was President at Westwood One and spent many years at the United Stations Radio Network. Salamon also programmed former Country outlets WHN-AM/New York and WEEP-AM/Pittsburgh. CRB President and CBS Country KMPS/Seattle PD Becky Brenner said, "For the past 12 months, the CRB has conducted an extensive review of its operations in terms of the organization's administrative functions and the execution of its flagship event, Country Radio Seminar. As a result of this review process, the CRB Board of Directors has initiated several changes, which are designed to keep the organization growing in this very challenging economic climate. A number of adjustments have already been made. As we continue our ongoing effort to ensure the vitality of our organization and achieve our mission of growth through sharing, we do anticipate additional changes."

Midwest Communications Talk WTAQ-AM/Green Bay PD and show host Jerry Bader has been suspended for two weeks for comments he made about Wisconsin Lt. Gov. Barbara Lawton. In his blog on the station's website, Bader said that Lawton's withdrawal from next year's gubernatorial race was due to marital difficulties; Bader retracted the comments and apologized after he reported that he had "lost confidence in the sources" for the story, but the station suspended him anyway.

The class action lawsuit filed against Clear Channel Country WBCT/Grand Rapids for its handling of a flooding incident at the station's Birthday Bash has been denied. Rain storms caused the Grand River to rise over its banks at the Ionia County Fairgrounds that weekend, trapping 14,000 cars – most of which we destroyed. Tuesday, attorney John Tallman argued that the cases of hundreds affected should all fall under one class action lawsuit instead of being handled on an individual basis, the Ionia County Judge disagreed. Tallman argued that everyone was affected by the same circumstances and therefore should be held to the same standard, explaining several people were reportedly told to stay put while the waters were rising, even giving the judge a transcript of an announcement made during the panic. Attorneys representing WBCT made a successful case for Comparative Negligence – saying that everyone has a different level of liability. The defense also argued some people may have heard warnings and decided to stay anyway, and there wasn't enough evidence to suggest that damages should be consistent. Expect hundreds of individual lawsuits to "flood" the court soon.

Pitts, the comic radio creation of former Clear Channel Talk WLW-AM/Cincinnati hast Gary Burbank – a former Conclave keynoter - appears in two campaign commercials for Quinlivan, the former reporter for ABC affiliate WCPO-TV and a friend of Burbank's who is running as a Democrat for the Council. The spots feature Pitts saying things

like "City Council, like underwear, needs to be changed from time to time."

The station says some listeners might "need a little Christmas now" with surrounding economic woes and the flu season.
